Representative Merry Clayton said:

"I think the peace agreement is a good deal. I think its flawed, but it's the best deal we're going to get. And President Perry has always been the business competitor of Mayor Hedberg, so of course he's going to say what he said. He's just throwing shade to get some press. He gets that way when nobody is paying attention to him for ten minutes. I think Prime Minister Modi is doing a great job and she should be commended, especially since she's had to step up after what happened with Bergman and Pinderson. None of the actions that resulted in their removal from office were ever traced back to Modi, and we need to be clear about that. I also think Representative Karimova is doing a great job, and I've been fortunate to work alongside both her and Representative Nguyen. Both of them are excellent candidates and either one would make a good president."

When pressed on who she would be supporting, Representative Clayton replied "We'll see what happens. We've got a debate coming up Friday and it will be a great opportunity for the candidates to get their ideas out there. I'll let you know after I hear what they have to say." Representative Zenyatta Mondatta says she supports Representative Kaur for President.

"We don't always agree, but I think she's got the leadership skills and the understanding to know what works and what doesn't. She'll make a wonderful president. She has my full support." With the peace agreement going to a vote stock in Solid State Electronics has gone up 7%. And that wasn't the only thing to go up. Prime Minister Modi, whose popularity in the wake of the Pinderson/Bergman scandal had dropped to 21%, saw her popularity shoot up to 57% after negotiating the terms of the peace agreement.
